David Coulter

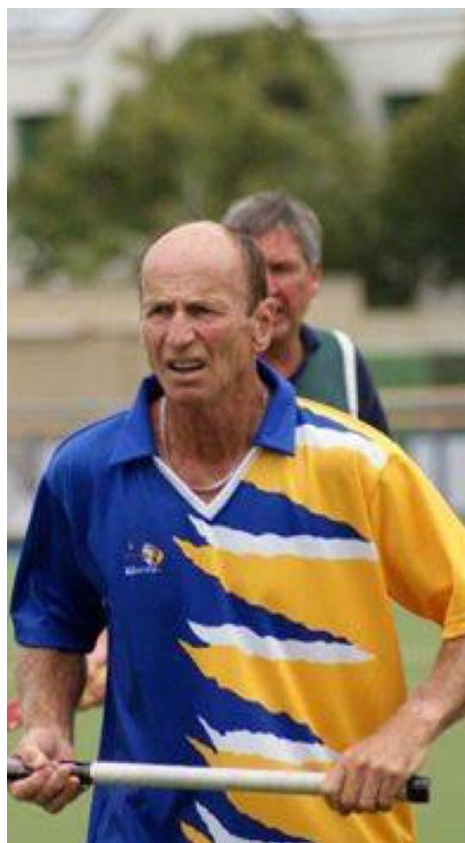

President's Report

I am pleased to report on the activities of the Avon Hockey Club in 2016 being the 16th season for the club.

The strong partnership with St Michael's School for our junior programme carries on and we continue to grow playing numbers of children at the entry end of our game. A huge thank you to all of the parents for their support throughout the season and a warm welcome to newcomers for what we hope will be many years of enjoyment following and encouraging your children in playing hockey through the various age levels. Michael Graveston leads the junior section ably assisted by Kurt Gurden and they have assembled a great group of enthusiastic coaches. Who knows how far some of these players will go in our game after receiving such a strong beginning, I wish each and every one of them many exciting opportunities from hockey in the years ahead. The club did commit increased resourcing for the junior section in 2016, specifically with spend on uniforms and more equipment and the teams reflected this well with great pride. Thank you to all those involved in our junior section; from players and parents through to the wonderful coaching volunteers, you were all a credit to the Avon Hockey Club in 2016.

Congratulations to those chosen for representative teams in 2016; Logan Cartwright-Keast - Canterbury A Primary Boys. Shahid Ali, Louie Harvey, Rihan Lallu - Canterbury B Primary Boys. Jake Goddard, Ben Cox - Canterbury Development Boys Team. Alex Brandrick, Oliver Battrick and Zoe Merino - Primary Development Training Squad. Keep up the great efforts, all of you.

In the Senior section of our club 2016 saw us enter the same teams as in the previous season. In the men's competitions we had CPL, Division 1, two Mid-week sides and a Grass team and in the women's competitions we entered CPL, Division 1, Division 4, Mid-week and a Grass team. Also in keeping with the previous season we only had the one side cover themselves in glory by winning their grade and that was the Mid-week ladies for the third straight year. Well done again ladies.

Our premier sides H&B Avon CPL Women's team finished 4th in the main competition and Kendons Avon CPL Men's came in tied 5th. Texture Group Division 1 Men's improved two spots to finish tied 3rd while the Division 1 Women's team were 8th in their grade. Mid-week Men's sides were 8th and tied 13th and the Men's Grass 2nd while the Women's Grass managed 6th. Our Division 4 women's team is a young combined side with Carlton Redcliffs and they ended 8th and bottom of their grade but with limitless enthusiasm to improve.

A number of our senior members achieved higher honours in 2016 by gaining selection into representative teams, notably two H&B Avon CPL Women's were members of the winning Canterbury Cats side being the pinnacle of domestic hockey, congratulations to Libby Bird and Jackie Eden. Ari Barrow had his first season with the Canterbury Cavaliers who narrowly lost in their national men's final to Midlands. We also had Canterbury Senior Men's and Women's representatives, the Beavers and Barracudas, with the Beavers again winning their national tournament and the Barracudas finishing 2nd. Avon players at these senior tournaments included Levi Barrow, Rob Buhler, Sophie Radovonich, and Zoe Pullar.

At the Under 21 level we had Sarah Walcott, Jackie Eden and Libby Bird in the Women's Canterbury team placing 5th. Ari Barrow captained the Under 21 Men's team leading them to a 6-0 victory in the tournament final and again being awarded the Canterbury Under 21 Men – Player of the Year, a great

achievement. Also to our Masters players of whom there are too many to name, well done on your representative duties in 2016. Congratulations to you all.

As well as those who excelled on the turf in 2016 we have a number of Avon Hockey Club members who were recognised by Canterbury Hockey for their enduring deeds off it. Congratulations to those gaining service awards. Gold Award to Lloyd Hughes and John Maunsell. Silver Award to Robin Cox and Anna Morgan. Bronze Award to Michael Graveston.

I would like to thank the committee who worked hard to enable the smooth running of the 2016 season. A special mention goes to Robin Cox who was awarded the Ross Gillespie Trophy in 2016 for her outstanding contribution to the club. We have a very capable group of volunteers that make this club function but we are always on the lookout for more help. If you cannot commit to the committee please commit to assisting wherever possible or just make things as easy as possible for those trying to get a job done. Essential to our club's health is a sound set of books and good control of the cash flows. Again big thanks must go to Kurt Gurden as Treasurer and Rob Gillespie who ably assists with the financials. Our financial position has remained positive over the year. Thanks must also go to our sponsors and the charitable trusts that support us, and we should look to support them in return if at all possible throughout the year: Hair Art & Beauty, Kendons, Texture Group Landscaping, Endeavour Solutions and The Lion Foundation, NZ Community Trust, Pub Charity.

I cannot close off on the 2016 report without paying tribute to two club members who passed away in January 2017. Dave Coulter had been involved with the Avon Hockey Club and its predecessor clubs for 60 years, so I cannot possibly do justice to his past contribution to Avon hockey and New Zealand hockey here. The duties done and office's held at club, provincial and national levels were many, he was truly a great contributor to the success of our game. Suffice to say his funeral was well attended by the wider hockey community and some great stories and memories recounted. It was with great pride that we are able to reflect on Dave's life with the knowledge that he was one of our own. We also lost Malcolm Begg, a Woolston club member since 1992 who really excelled when it came to masters hockey. Malcolm represented Canterbury Masters teams from 1997 to 2016 and played New Zealand Masters also throughout that period right up to 2015. All those that played in sides with Malcolm will attest to not only was he a skilful and lithe player he was a genuinely good guy to be around. Both men will be fondly remembered by the club.

So we have seen a busy season close with a number of great achievements by individuals, but importantly a lot of enjoyment, teamwork and competitive spirit realised by the wider club members throughout their respective teams and competitions. Looking forward it is my goal for Avon Hockey Club to be recognised as the most enjoyable club to play for. This starts with our conduct, and our supporters conduct, off the field being positive right through to the detail of communication among team mates around all facets of our sport, on-field, off-field, at training or in a social environment. I expect players to compete hard but play fair, to be restrained in any comments to officials and be respectful towards other players. Treasurer's Report

2016 was another strong year for the club financially. We set out to continue to grow the club's cashflow to enable us to provide better services to our players and coaches. I think it would be great if we were to have our own independent facilities sometime down the track!

Going in to the season, the club had several goals it wanted to achieve, being to get our entire junior club into one single uniform, purchase and upgrade our junior goalie gear, improve debtor collection times and say thanks to our coaches.

We are very thankful to NZCT, who provided a grant to us of \$3,000 for the purchase of 70 new junior uniforms. As a result, we now have all our juniors in one single, professional looking uniform, rather than the 3-4 different uniforms we had in 2015. We also added new teams at the Kiwi Sticks and Kwik Sticks levels, which are required to play with a goalie. This meant the purchase of new goalie gear was required – we are very thankful to Mainland Foundation for this.

One other area that has been lacking is senior goalie gear. The club invested significantly in this over the year, with the purchase of new gear for our MWO Men's goalie, Div 1 Men's goalie and also MWO Women goalie. We are very thankful to the Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Trust who assisted us with these purchases. We are still not there however, and I will be aiming to fund the purchase even more new goalie gear to replace some of our current, aging gear.

One badly needed purchase took place during the year. This was the purchase of a new website. The club invested \$1,500 in a WordPress site designed by AllTeams, who specialise in sports websites. This investment has allowed control of our website to be given back to the committee who can update this themselves without delay.

For us, collection times for subs has always been something that our club could always do better. To encourage this, we brought in a new system whereby players were offered a discount if they paid their subs on time. This new system was a success, with players taking advantage of the discount and a significant improvement to collection times.

As we look forward, the cost of hockey continues to increase, with Canterbury Hockey having to increase the affiliation and game costs charged to us by 5%. With this, we have slightly increased our subs across the board, however the cost to the club will continue to be significantly more than we charge our players. With the addition of Youth and Div 2 teams in 2017, this makes up bigger shortfalls to fund. We therefore are being proactive in reviewing our fundraising activities and apply for grant funding. We thank the organisations who provided us grant funding to assist with turf and match fees during the year – Pub Charity and Lion Foundation especially. Your support is hugely appreciated by the club. To our sponsors, H&B, Kendons, and Texture Group – a big thanks also.

The goals for 2017 will be to continue grow the club's cashflow so we can invest in areas badly needed for the club – gear upgrades, new uniforms, coach support etc.

As always, the treasurer job is not a one-person job and I thank Rob Gillespie for all his assistance during the year. Also, a big thanks to the committee for their continued support and backing of the finance team.

Junior Club Co-ordinator's Report

The dedicated coaches, team managers and the parents ensure the success of each season. A big thank you to all for making it all work!!

We have continued to grow in numbers with 106 junior members. We were represented in all junior grades, including 20 children in our Funsticks year 1-2 programme, a boys and girls separate Ministick teams, 2 boys and 2 girls Kiwistick teams, resumptions this year of the girls 11 aside Kwik Sticks, a boy's 11 aside Kwik Sticks with an additional boy's 6 aside Kwik Sticks. Each week all teams played with full numbers, coaches and team managers present. Practices and the Funstick programme were all held on Shirley Boys High turf on Thursday evenings over a 3-hour slot. Even though we increased our time slot at times there is still too much activity to fit on in this time.

We were very well represented by the boys in Canterbury Hockey Association representative teams with Logan Cartwright-Keast selected as a representative Primary A Boys: Rihan Lallu, Louie Harvey, Shahid Ali making Primary B Boys Representatives; Ben Cox and Jack Goddard making Primary Development sides. We had several girls in representative trails but we are still struggling to make it into girl's representative teams.

A lot of other teams did well in being grading then up into higher divisions.

2016 Summer Hockey was a big success with 55 children choosing to continue their hockey in the summer months. On top of that we had 3 senior teams covering Secondary, Adult Novice and adult experience grades. All had a ball. A lot of the Summer success is down the Kurt Gurden who inspires all the kids to continue no matter what. Thanks Kurt for all you do! Also for the tireless support of Hugh Williams always reliably there week in and out helping when ever asked. The dedication of these two is beyond words.

Our coaches are wonderful and we continue to be blessed that they return each year to give of their time. This year we had two Avon senior members Dominique Scheepers and Chris Mc Cloy (with baby as key supporter) volunteer to co-coach one of our Kiwistick sides. They were an instant success with Dominique leading and Chris being layback Kool with the Boys – a great pairing. But as we grow we do need more experienced coaches. Our assistant coach programme, where as our players leave to senior Hockey we invite the more mature ones to join us as assistant coaches with the hope that in the years to come they will grow into full coaches. In 2016 we saw Ella Stewart and Daniel Hayward being promoted to full coaches with Hamish Church, Angus Jonker and Johanna Church joining us assistant coaches for the first time.

A big thank you to the 2016 Avon committee who funded the Junior Hockey with two complete junior goalie kits, 70 new junior uniforms which allowed us to outfit all our girl teams into new uniforms and give us more uniforms for 2017 growth. We now have supplied each coach with a gear bags to help keep things together and purchased face guards for those fearsome boys 11-a-side corners. It is also the clubs fundraisers, grant applications completed during the year including junior hockey chocolate bar sales that keep the club tricking so I ask everyone to support these.

Our website and Facebook continue to communicate well. In 2016, we saw Junior Hockey Merchandise being introduced to our online merchandise range this allows members to buy an array of junior support clothing etc. This came useful with the introduction of summer uniform tops where players could purchase them directly of the website

Our end of season review meeting was held with coaches and team managers continuing to fine tune so we improve how we do things in future season

Umpiring Training courses were attended with one club umpiring training being held at Shirley Boys High School, several do regular umpiring at Cathedral Grammar, including Ella Stewart & Jasmine Hanrahan. This year the junior division of the club were asked to mentor new umpires at Cathedral Grammar. Hugh Williams, Kurt Gurden, Shaun Graveston and myself covered this task every Saturday morning. All these people also have their own team they are coaching. So while it was all covered it is expecting more from already overloaded people. For me these extra duties has meant reduced time for getting around the other fields to ensure each junior team is supported functioning well.

To finish on a positive note, the 2017 season is about to start, registrations are coming in, practice fields are all booked. This Thursday we are having our preseason Potluck Coaches meeting and trials will be under from mid-March. All things in the Junior Hockey world are good.

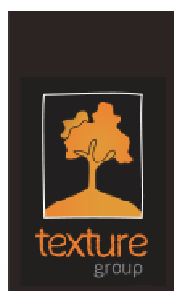

Club Objectives

The objectives of Avon Hockey Club Incorporated are:

- f) To provide social activities for its members.
- g) To undertake all things that are incidental to achieving these objectives.

Club Structure

Avon Hockey Club Incorporated is comprised of a committee of 13 voluntary persons, including key positions of President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Men's/Women's/Junior Club Captains, with all other positions being general committee positions. The club operates with the assistance of volunteer coaches and managers.

The Club operates under two divisions, being senior and junior club. The senior club operates under the oversight of the committee and offers hockey in both men's and women's grades as well as youth grade. The junior division also acts under the oversight of the committee and junior club captain. Hockey is offered to all junior players. The junior division operates in partnership with St. Michael's Church School.

Main Sources and Methods to Obtain Cash and Resources

Avon Hockey Club Incorporated's main sources of cash are from the receipt of player subscriptions, grant funding from local organisations, sponsorship, fundraising – primarily from pub quizzes and junior chocolate fundraisers, and other sundry sources.

Avon Hockey Club Incorporated is reliant on volunteers to operate the club and its teams. The Club currently employs no persons to assist with its operation. The Club receives very few donated goods from other persons or parties.





Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 October 2016

1 Statement of Accounting Policies

These are the financial statements of Avon Hockey Club Incorporated. The club is an incorporated society established under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 by a deed dated 22 May 2001.

The Club has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared on the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Measurement System

These financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis. The financial statements are presented in New Zealand dollars (NZ\$).

Particular Accounting Policies

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the club in the preparation of these financial statements.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at their estimated realisable value.

Grants

Grants received are recognised in operating revenue unless specific conditions are attached to a grant and repayment of the grant is required where these conditions are not met. In these cases, the grant is treated as a liability until the conditions are met.

Goods and Services Tax

Financial information in these accounts is recorded exclusive of GST with the exception of receivables and payables, which include GST. GST payable or receivable at balance date is included in the appropriate category in the Statement of Financial Position.

Plant, Property and Equipment

Property, Plant and Equipment are recognised at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Depreciation rates are disclosed in the asset schedule.

Taxation

The club meets the tax exemptions of section CW 46 in the Income Tax Act 2007 and therefore is not subject to payment of income tax.

Changes in Accounting Policies

The Club adopted PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (NotFor-Profit) reporting for the year ended 31 March 2016, after previously applying New Zealand equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (Differential Reporting). The change in reporting standards had minimal impact on the accounting policies of the Club.

There are no contingent liabilities at year end (31 October 2015: \$Nil).

3 Capital Commitments

There are no capital commitments at year end (31 October 2015: \$Nil)

In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the trust's preparation of the performance report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the trust's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the performance report.

As is common with other organisations of a similar nature, control over cash receipts from subscriptions and fundraising activities prior to being recorded is limited and there are no practical audit procedures to determine the effect of this limited control. In this respect alone, we have not been able to obtain all the information and explanations that we have required.
