President's Report

I am pleased to report on the activities of the Avon Hockey Club in 2017 being the 17th season for the club.

We continue to enjoy a great partnership with St Michael's School for our junior programme. Our playing numbers of children continue to grow at the entry end of our game. In 2017 we had Fun Sticks, Mini Angels, Dragons, Swans, Wonder Girls, Blitz, Magic, Makos, Panthers, Jaguars, Stars, Angels, Avengers and Stags. It will be a challenge to keep up with naming the sides in 2018 as we expect more growth. A huge thank you to all the parents for their support throughout the season and a warm welcome to newcomers for what we hope will be many years of enjoyment following and encouraging your children in playing hockey through the various age levels. Michael Graveston leads the junior section ably assisted by Hugh Williams and their enthusiastic group of great coaches. We can always use more support in this area so if there are any members or parents keen to be involved with coaching or managing a junior side please let Michael know. Each year I ask myself who out of these junior players will go on in our game to the highest level after receiving such a strong beginning. I am sure there will be many exciting opportunities from hockey in the years ahead. Thank you to all those involved in our junior section; from players and parents through to the wonderful coaching volunteers, you were all a credit to the Avon Hockey Club in 2017. Congratulations to those chosen for representative teams in 2017; Jake Goddard, Ben Cox and Alex Brandrick. Keep up the great efforts, all of you.

In the senior section our club entered two new teams in 2017, a youth men's team and a Division 2 women's team. We had 204 registered players in 2017 up from 158 in 2016 being 29% growth. In the men's competitions we had CPL, Division 1, two Mid-week sides a Grass team, and Youth team. In the women's competitions we entered CPL, Division 1, Division 2, Division 3, Mid-week and a Grass team. We again only had the one side achieve glory by winning their grade and that was the Grass Men's team, congratulations to those muddy warriors.

Our premier sides H&B Avon CPL Women's team finished tied 5th in the main competition and Avon CPL Men's came in 5th also. Texture Group Division 1 Men's slipped down to 7th while the Division 1 Women's team improved one place to 7th in their grade. Division 2 ladies came in 9th in their first season so onwards and upwards from here. Our Division 3 women's team played in level 3 and finished 4th in their competition and our Youth men's team playing level 1 performed really well and finished a very credible 2nd place in their first season. Mid-week Men's sides were 6th and 14th while the Mid-week ladies who had won the previous 3 seasons could only manage 4th in 2017. Superb effort by the Men's Grass team for winning the grade, our only table topping side of the year, while the Women's Grass managed 5th.

A number of our senior members achieved higher honours in 2017 by gaining selection into representative teams, most notably Libby Bird again making the Canterbury Cats side being the pinnacle of domestic hockey, and also competing for the Under 21's. Bella Forbes, Sophie Radovonich and Libby Morris all played for the Barracudas with Libby Morris also playing at the Under 18 Regional level and achieving New Zealand Black Sticks Under 18 selection. Ari Barrow played for the Beavers team with Joseph Yoon and Bertie Ruscoe playing Under 18 Regional's and Bertie going on to be selected for the New Zealand Black Sticks Under 18's. Harrison Darling played for the Under 18 Association team, Hamish Church and Archie Batchelor the Under 15's and Shahid Ali and Logan

Cartwright-Keast all playing Under 15 B's. Congratulations to all these Avon members who represented Canterbury in 2017.

I would like to thank the committee who worked hard to enable the smooth running of the 2017 season. A special mention goes to Zoe Pullar who was awarded the Ross Gillespie Trophy in 2017 for her outstanding contribution to the club. We have a very capable group of volunteers that make this club function but we are always on the lookout for more help. If you cannot commit to the committee please commit to assisting wherever possible or just make things as easy as possible for those trying to get a job done. We need people to step up as coaches or managers as our club grows so please come forward if this is something that may interest you. Special mention to Robin Cox for all the secretarial work put in to keep the club functioning and essential to our club's health is a sound set of books and good control of the cash flows, so big thanks must go to Kurt Gurden as Treasurer who manages our finances. Our financial position has remained positive over the year. Thanks must also go to our sponsors and the charitable trusts that support us, and we should look to support them in return if at all possible throughout the year: Hair Art & Beauty, The Lion Foundation, NZ Community Trust, Pub Charity and Mainland Foundation.

I wish to simply repeat my message from last year as we still have progress to make. We have seen a 2017 season close that carried with it a lot of enjoyment, teamwork and competitive spirit realised by the wider club members throughout their respective teams and competitions. It remains my goal for Avon Hockey Club to be recognised as the most enjoyable club to play for. This starts with our conduct, and our supporters conduct, off the field being positive right through to the detail of communication among team mates around all facets of our sport, on-field, off-field, at training or in a social environment. I expect players to compete hard but play fair, to be restrained in any comments to officials and be respectful towards other players. I firmly believe winners are grinners but also we need to remember why we play the game, ultimately it must be because we enjoy it, win or lose. Please front up in 2018 hungry for the competition but with wide smiles and lots of positivity, be welcoming to new members, always play the game in good spirit and let's be noticed by the Canterbury community as the club whose players get the most reward from our sport irrespective of the individual match results. Thank you all for your contributions to Avon Hockey Club life in 2017 and I look forward to a positive and enjoyable 2018 season.

Treasurer's Report

Another season, another productive year from the financial corner! The club was put under strong demand this year to find even more financial resources. The club continues its strong growth and increases its player base with two additional teams in the senior club and four new teams in the junior club. The growth is excellent for the club and will provide a stronger player base for future seasons. With new teams comes increased costs for the club to find funds for. The club has to find several thousands of dollars for each new team that we enter – this from the losses we make on subs from each player, uniform purchases, goalie gear etc. I am happy to say that we found this funding through the year and managed to maintain a strong cash position.

We are very thankful to our sponsors of the club – H&B continue to be our wonderful sponsor of the CPL Women. Orbit Protect assisted us at junior level by supplying the entire junior club with 120 drink bottles – this was awesome to provide to our junior teams and gave us a much more professional look!

With our huge growth this year, we are very thankful for the assistance which has been provided by Pub Charity who granted the club \$10,000 and Lion Foundation who granted \$6,000 for turf and match fees. NZCT provided the club \$3,000 for our new Youth Boys team for new uniforms and goalie gear. We are also very thankful to the Mainland Foundation who provided the club \$1,500 for junior goalie gear when we urgently realised we would have an additional two Kiwi Sticks Girls teams that we didn't expect.

The financial statements show a profit of \$8,162. As usual with our not-for-profit organisation, this is not a true indicator of performance given grant revenues for asset purchases (uniforms, goalie gear etc.) come through the profit and loss without the corresponding costs recognised as an expense. The true indicator is the Statement of Cash Flows which showed a minor drop of \$591 in cash over the year – this shows we didn't need to dip into reserves to fund our growth.

Looking to the 2018 season, we have a very challenging season ahead financially. We appear to have all teams returning with a possible additional two teams at Division 3 level. This will put a lot of pressure on cash flow as it is could more new teams to fund, should they go ahead. We had a tough start to the year with Pub Charity declining a grant for turf and match fees that we have received for the last four years. We are hopeful of success however with other grant application which have been submitted. If we can maintain our cash position this season, I will be happy as treasurer.

Our fees for 2018 will also need to increase as Canterbury Hockey increase their costs to us. We also try to keep these as manageable of possible to our members and we have some of the cheapest subs of the Canterbury clubs.

Thanks to our awesome committee who have been very supportive over the year. Here's to a great 2018 season, and we look forward to a successful one!!

Junior Club Co-ordinator's Report

The dedicated coaches, team managers and the parents ensure the success of each season. A big thank you to all for making it all work!!

2017 Teams

We have continued to grow in numbers with 114 junior members and 14 teams. We were represented in all junior grades: Including 12 children in our Funsticks year 1-2 programme, 8 down on 2016 season, a boys and girls separate Ministicks teams, in the Kiwisticks grade with 3 Boys and 4 Girls Kiwistick teams. A large number of these players came from "have-a-go day" which we supported this year and most of those children had never played sport before. This year Year 7 & 8's had the girls 11 aside Kwik Sticks, a Boy's 11 aside Kwik Sticks with a Boy's 6 aside Kwik Sticks The additional Kwik Sticks side for 2017 was a Girl's 6 aside Kwik Sticks side. A total of 4 new teams for 2017. Each week all teams played with full numbers, coaches and team managers present. Practices and the Funsticks programme were all held on Shirley Boys High School turf on Thursday evenings over a 4-hour slot, one hour longer than in 2016 but needed to accommodate the 4 new teams.

Players Selected for Representative & Development Sides

We were again very well represented by the Boys in Canterbury Hockey Association representative teams with Alex Brandrick making it into Canterbury Primary Development Team and Ben Cox and Jake Goddard into the Canterbury Primary B Boys Team. The Canterbury Primary B Boys won 1st place winning the McGrath Trophy while the Primary Development Boys took 1st place at Festival of Hockey. WELL DONE!

We had several girls in representative trails but we are still struggling to make it into girls representative teams.

A healthy team of 8, year 7/8 Avon/St. Michaels players turned up week in and out to be mentored as new umpires. The improvement in confidence and ability was tremendous. We will be looking at supporting new players who would be interested in this programme in 2018.

Thank you to all of our Coaches and senior partners who acted as junior umpire mentors throughout the season. After a difficult start with Coaches being over stretched, with Avon clubs help we were able to call on more mentors. If we can retain these people in 2018 season it will mean we will have a good pool to call on.

2017 Summer Hockey

Continues to be a big success with 64 children and 40 secondary / Adults players choosing to continue their Hockey into the summer months. Everyone continues to enjoy this more social league. Hugh Williams has been a great help in running this summer programme. Thanks Hugh for all you do! Always reliably there week in and out helping when ever asked.

Our Coaches

Our coaches are wonderful and we continue to be blessed that they return each year to give of their time. This year we had 6 new coaches, 8 new assistant coaches. In total have full coaches team of 30. Of note we had Alana MacGregor from our senior Avon partners who very successfully took our Fun Sticks programme with new assistant coaches: Maddi Tucker and Louie Harvey who both have played through all our junior grades before now joining our assistant coach programme, Ross Howard who took our boys 6 aside Kwik sticks side. Ross was also from our senior Avon partners. We also saw some of our parents step up to help coach with Leisa Francois coaching a Kiwi Sticks girl's side alongside Mel Patterson, Glenn Hanrahan who were assistant coaches to several of our junior teams. We also welcomed back Jeremy Willis who has returned to coach after several years break. Thanks to Mrs Willis who gave you permission to return.

In 2017 we saw several of our assistant coaches promoted to full coaches namely Hamish Church, Angus Jonker, Gemma Rowlands and Thomas Bennett. While we had new young people join our assistant coach pool with the two named before and the additions of Henry Bagshaw, Logan Cartwright Keast and Fiona Hoyland.

But as we grow we continue to need more experienced coaches. Our assistant coach programme, where as our players leave to senior Hockey we invite the more mature ones to join us as assistant coaches with the hope that in the years to come they will grow into full coaches.

Thank You

A big thank you to the 2017 Avon committee who funded 4 sets of goalie gear, balls and other equipment. Junior club is now better equipped than ever. It is the club's fundraisers, grant applications completed during the year including junior hockey chocolate bar sales that keep the club tricking. I thank everyone involved in these and ask everyone to support these as it allows us to function.

We also need to show our gratitude to Lee-Bin Tee for the donation of 120 Avon St. Michaels drinking bottles, Jeff Cox & Rachel Vavasour for hundreds of blocks of Chocolates which were given out each week for player of the day and best effort and Viv McCaskey for providing equipment tags for our equipment.

Communications

Our website and Facebook continue to communicate well. New merchandise lines are being introduced to our online merchandise range this allows members to buy an array of junior support clothing etc. Summer uniform tops for players can be purchased directly of the website

Looking Ahead

Our end of season review meeting was held with Coaches and team Managers continuing to fine tune so we improve how we do things in future seasons. The 2018 summer hockey season is now in full swing with 74 participating. 2018 winter season is about to start registrations, practice fields are all booked. By the time you read this our pre-season coaches meeting would have been done and trials will be underway from mid-March. All things in the junior hockey world are good.

Club Objectives

The objectives of Avon Hockey Club Incorporated are:

- f) To provide social activities for its members.
- g) To undertake all things that are incidental to achieving these objectives.

Club Structure

Avon Hockey Club Incorporated is comprised of a committee of 12 voluntary persons, including key positions of President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Men's/Women's/Junior Club Captains, with all other positions being general committee positions. The club operates with the assistance of volunteer coaches and managers.

The Club operates under two divisions, being senior and junior club. The senior club operates under the oversight of the committee and offers hockey in both men's and women's grades as well as youth grade. The junior division also acts under the oversight of the committee and junior club captain. Hockey is offered to all junior players. The junior division operates in partnership with St. Michael's Church School.

Main Sources and Methods to Obtain Cash and Resources

Avon Hockey Club Incorporated's main sources of cash are from the receipt of player subscriptions, grant funding from local organisations, sponsorship, fundraising – primarily from pub quizzes and junior chocolate fundraisers, and other sundry sources.

Avon Hockey Club Incorporated is reliant on volunteers to operate the club and its teams. The Club currently employs no persons to assist with its operation. The Club receives very few donated goods from other persons or parties.

The club participates in a performance programme which is run by Canterbury Hockey. The programme assesses a club's ability to meet certain performance objectives. Categories include; strategic planning for success, looking after volunteers, growing our club, developing our coaches, developing our umpires, playing the game, our facilities/equipment, looking after our members.

Clubmark accreditation has three different levels – gold, silver, and bronze. The higher the level achieved, the better a club has demonstrated their ability to meet the KPIs set out as part of the programme. 





1 Statement of Accounting Policies

This is the performance report of Avon Hockey Club Incorporated. The club is an incorporated society established under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 by a deed dated 22 May 2001.

The Club has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the performance report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The performance report is prepared on the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Measurement System

This performance report has been prepared on a historical cost basis. The performance report is presented in New Zealand dollars (NZ\$).

Particular Accounting Policies

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the club in the preparation of this performance report.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at their estimated realisable value.

Grants

Grants received are recognised in operating revenue unless specific conditions are attached to a grant and repayment of the grant is required where these conditions are not met. In these cases, the grant is treated as a liability until the conditions are met.

Goods and Services Tax

Financial information in these accounts is recorded exclusive of GST with the exception of receivables and payables, which include GST. GST payable or receivable at balance date is included in the appropriate category in the Statement of Financial Position.

Plant, Property and Equipment

Property, Plant and Equipment are recognised at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Depreciation rates are disclosed in the asset schedule.

Taxation

The club meets the tax exemptions of section CW 46 in the Income Tax Act 2007 and therefore is not subject to payment of income tax.

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in previous years.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less than those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on the performance report.

Other than in our capacity as assurance practitioner, we have no relationship with, or interests in, the Club.

Other information in the Performance Report

The Club's rules state the financial statements of the entity are to be audited or reviewed annually, there is no statutory audit requirement therefore our review report does not make any statement in regard to the information presented in the statement of service performance or entity information.

Basis for Qualified Conclusion

As is common with other organisations of a similar nature, control over cash receipts from subscriptions and fundraising activities prior to being recorded is limited and there are no practical audit procedures to determine the effect of this limited control. In this respect alone, we have not been able to obtain all the information and explanations that we have required.
